



Idle Free Earth Day!

Sixty seconds. A mere sixty seconds is the amount of time Natural Resources Canada recommends you leave your engine idling while running errands, chatting with a friend, waiting at the ferry or picking your children up from

Avoiding unnecessary engine idling is something we can all immediately do to minimize our contribution to global climate change. Vehicle emissions greatly contribute to atmospheric pollutants, including greenhouse gases — the

gases responsible for the climatic warming we are experiencing on Earth. In fact, every liter of gasoline consumed emits around 2.4kgs of carbon dioxide (CO2).

Natural Resources Canada advises "If every driver of a light-duty vehicle in Canada avoided idling for just five minutes a day, we would prevent more than 1.4 million tonnes of CO2 from entering the atmosphere each year." This is the equivalent of taking an estimated 490,000 cars off the road each year.

A recent study suggests that in the peak of winter, Canadians voluntarily idle their vehicles for a combined total of more than 75 million minutes a day – equivalent to one vehicle idling for 143 years.

Salt Spring Island has a serious engine idling problem. On any given day you can find drivers engine idling their vehicles at the ferry terminal, outside cafes, banks, the library, at communal mailboxes, at the side of the road chatting on their cellphones, or having a 'Salt Spring' moment and chatting to a neighbor.

Vehicle emissions, aside from being a significant source of greenhouse gases, are also a major contributor to worsening air quality in the Capital Regional District (CRD). This is of particular concern for children and individuals with breathing challenges. Interestingly enough, Natural Resources Canada found that drivers with children are more likely to idle than individuals without children.

Although not widely known, an engine idling bylaw came into effect in the CRD in 2009. The Bylaw to Promote Clean Air by Regulating Motor Vehicle Idling (Bylaw No. #3533) was created in recognition that "Motor vehicles are sources of particulate matter, nitrogen oxide, carbon monoxide, sulphur oxide, and volatile organic compounds which are a health hazard to the inhabitants of the Capital Regional District" and for the "...purposes of maintaining, promoting and preserving the public health of the inhabitants of the Capital Regional District..."

The bylaw enforces unnecessary engine idling and asks that CRD residents refrain from engine idling for more than three consecutive minutes.

In celebration of Earth Day 2010, let's make a commitment to give up engine idling our vehicles, and if we see someone participating in unnecessary idling on Salt Spring Island, we can politely remind them that greenhouse gases are a major source of global climate change.



Remembering Author Ray Grigg writes a we

Author Ray Grigg writes a weekly environmental column, Shades of Green, which is published regularly in the Campbell River North Islander.

Remember Y2K? A decade ago, technology experts were warning about a massive malfunction of the world's computers because these time-sensitive machines would not be able to transition from December 31, 1999, to the first day of new millennium on January 1, 2000. The problem was that existing computers had not been programmed with full year designations. In order save precious memory, 1971 was just coded as 71, so when 99 came to an end, the next date would be read as a nonspecific 00. The ubiquitous use of these electronic wonders in everything from financial transactions and airline reservations to store stocking and nuclear reactor safety systems meant that the arrival of the new millennium could be heralded with communication chaos.

Then January 1, 2000, arrived. Nothing of consequence happened. "A few reactors in Japan temporarily lost the ability to monitor their safety equipment; some Australian bus-ticket machines failed to operate; in Delaware, 150 racetrack slot machines stopped working" (Globe & Mail, Jan. 2/10). The world carried on as before, people dismissively shrugged their shoulders and called Y2K a false alarm. But the truth is a cautionary tale worth remembering.

Unbeknownst to most people, the warnings did set in motion a frenzy of corrective activity. Hundreds of billions of dollars were spent around the world to re write old programs or to purchase new equipment. Information technology was energized and experienced a boom in profits. Businesses and governments that bought new computers found that the gain in efficiency quickly paid for their investment. Soaring profits for manufacturers resulted in more research and better products, advancing the technology and the economy as a whole. Not only was a very real disaster averted but the solution brought innumerable benefits.





The environmental warnings we are receiving these days are a mirror of the Y2K event. And in almost every case, the call is for prevention, for taking early action before the problems escalate into crises that cause irreparable ecological damage and incur outrageously expensive costs in dollars, social disruption and human suffering < if, indeed, the problems can even be solved should we wait too long before attending to them. Consider the following warnings:

- We know with near-certainty that open net-pen salmon farms, particularly those on migratory routes of outgoing wild smolts, infect native salmon with sea lice. The history of sad experiences with farm-borne parasites and diseases in Norway, Scotland and Chile almost guarantee that they will eventually arrive in British Columbia's biologically rich West Coast. Why not mandate closed-containment systems for salmon farming before even greater ecological damage occurs here?
- The deposit of tar sands in Alberta is the second largest known reserve of oil on the planet. It is also the world's "dirtiest" supply of oil. The enthusiasm with which it is being mined and processed is leading inevitably to a wide range of ecological problems. Why not conserve this precious and non-renewable resource for a time when "peak oil" makes it a scarce and desperately needed commodity? Why ship it wholesale to an energy gluttonous United States? Why even consider bringing supertankers to BC's West Coast by moving it by pipeline to Kitimat? This is a fool's strategy that will simply feed Asia's energy appetite, encourage unwanted carbon dioxide emissions, and invite an inevitable spill to the Great Bear Rainforest, one of the most valuable biological regions on Earth.
- Minerals are a non-renewable resource. And they are getting harder to find. And when they are found, extraction usually accelerates ecological damage by intruding into unspoiled regions. The time has come for a global inventory of these limited resources, a metering of their extraction and a careful capture and reuse of all metals. We must stop acting as if we live on a planet of endless resources.
- At present rates of catch, industrial fishing of the world's oceans is set to exhaust all supplies of commercial species by 2040. Many species are already at critically low populations. Biologists suggest that the only way of stopping this impending disaster is to reduce catches and to designate about one-third of the world's oceans as protected marine reserves. No fishing. Stocks will rebuild within these sanctuaries and spread beyond, where then can be harvested, theoretically in perpetuity. Why isn't Canada and other nations taking a leadership role in preventing this looming disaster? • Every city, town and village can bend provincial and national governments toward solving environmental problems by taking a leadership role. Every community can conscientiously recycle, process garbage for raw materials and energy, protect local green spaces and mandate energy efficiencies. They can take a visionary role in thoughtful planning, sustainable use of natural resources, eliminating pollution and raising the profile of sustainability with their citizens. If these became primary objectives in every community, they would generate new employment, encourage innovation, promote health, improve lifestyles and produce a myriad of other benefits both promising and unexpected.

The Y2K event should remind us that we can avoid disasters if we heed warnings. The preemptive action of a decade ago is precisely the corrective tactic that needs to be embraced today by businesses, politicians and the general public. When remembering Y2K, Paul Saffo of California's Institute for the Future, reminds us that, "In the end we did the right thing but we waited until the last minute to do it, and it was very expensive because of that" (Ibid.). Let's hope that we don't have to learn the meaning of "very expensive" when it comes to our looming environmental challenges.






