



I love preparing seafood and just simply enjoy finding new and delectable ways to prepare new and exciting dishes. And perhaps most of all I simply love oysters.

More than anywhere in the world, oyster farming has become an incredible success here in B.C. World class techniques and oyster farming science have created an amazing range of incomparable and elegant varieties of oysters..and Surprise! Surprise!... all of them have been developed from the original native Pacific Oyster stock. It is almost incredible to believe that the 20 or so different varieties of ovsters, so delicate and varied in size, texture, taste and distinctive flavor available to us here on the B.C. coast, came from the same stock. But they all do. Similar to the sublime and extraordinary techniques of wine production, it is in the unique and distinctive aquaculture techniques that such a wide range of remarkable and exotic oysters are created. According to Sandra Hamilton of Pacific Kiss Oysters, oyster farming here on the West Coast has truly become an art form. She eloquently explained that like the "terroir" that gives wine its exceptional and marvelous qualities, there is a "merroir", or specific geographic aquatic location that lends an authentic and quintessential quality to oysters also. Oysters can be raised on the beach, or in suspended trays in the ocean. Depths of culturing can be varied. Different techniques like "tumbling" are used resulting in amazing and unforgettable flavors. Some varieties like the Sinku oyster are harvested at the incredible depth of 70 feet, and they are pink and translucent and incredibly delicate. So much to learn!! So the next time you shuck an outrageously exquisite and marvelously succulent oyster, think of all the years of effort and care that has been spent making oysters here in B.C. on the coast such a simply delicious experience. I know I do. And if you happen to be heading up towards Comox in late June, you might enjoy the Comox Valley Shellfish Festival on June 20th. And if not, head on down to Moby's for some of our world-class Until then...Keep smiling!! ~ Georgiana oysters and just enjoy!

Oysters Rockefeller

In 1899 when Jules Alciatore of Antoine's Restaurant in New Orleans created and served his oyster dish, a customer said, "this dish is as rich as Rockefeller"...and because it was green and the color of American greenbacks, the name and the reference to the wealthy John D. Rockefeller stuck.

Simple and Quick Recipe

Shuck a dozen oysters and save the bottom shells with the oysters in them. Prepare a sauce with 1/2 cup chopped spinach,

3 tablespoons butter 2 finely chopped green onions.

3 cloves minced garlic A dash of Tabasco sauce

Salt and pepper to taste.

Cover the oysters with the sauce

Then grate fresh parmesan cheese over them and flash broil them in the oven. Add lemon juice, and seafood sauce if you wish, and... VIOLA!





High Art: On The Rock

Salt Spring artists prepare for 2nd Annual Masterpiece Weekend June 18-20th, 2010

Salt Spring Island, BC – May 2010 – 24 artists with some diverse interests including yacht racing, Islamic mathematics, and Italian sustainable living, all share one passion: creating their 'best work' for Masterpiece Weekend. Salt Spring's premier art event boasts works by nationally and internationally renowned artists with eclectic backgrounds and sensibilities that attract art collectors from around the world. Scottish by birth and a transplant to Canada, Ronald Smith has an affinity for the sea. Smith has travelled extensively, sailed across the Pacific and raced yachts through BC waters. The one time Coordinator of Fine Art for the BC Ministry of Education, has painted for 60 years using light, colour and space to guide his artistic preferences. His new work titled, "Inter Tidal" came to him while looking out his window at the water view of Wallace Island, the Trincomali Channel and Galiano Island, all within sight of his art studio.

For artist Ronald T. Crawford, his work is inspired by a recent trip to Tofino, on BC's west coast. "My work called, 'The Resistance to Freedom' was inspired while watching the white suds fade into the sand and then furl back into the ocean. The contrasting patterns remind me of movements I equate with fundamentalism and the movement of water, freedom." Crawford is also inspired by the show's theme. And you won't be disappointed with




