

HE COWICHAN CONNECTION

Saltspring vigilantes ended rustlers' reign with guns blazing

f the pioneer Saltspring Island settler for whom Mount Maxwell is named had been asked to present his resume, it's unlikely that he would have listed vigilante among his achievements. Yet such he was, once. It was John Maxwell who, with his equally frustrated neighbours, brought Cowichan renegade John McCawley's career to a close, sudden-like.

Mystery surrounds McCawley's early adventures. An Englishman described as tall and handsome, with a "fine, curled, waxed mustache, which he would twirl with his fingers as he ogled the ladies," he arrived on Vancouver Island by way of Hawaii, San Francisco and New Westminster.

He'd had to depart Hawaii in a hurry-something about embezzlement-and he was only a step ahead of San Francisco's infamous Vigilance Committee when he again had to high-tail it, this time to the greener pastures of the future British Columbia. Here, after charges of assault were dropped, he set out to make his fortune as an unlicensed whiskey trader.

McCawley (or McCauley) did more than make a nuisance of himself, if you believe Capt. John T. Walbran. According to the author of the classic reference work, British Columbia Coast Names, John provoked the history-making

Fraser River gold rush. Arrested for bootlegging, McCawley showed his captors a small treasure in gold dust that he'd acquired in trade from Lower Mainland natives. The British seamen ultimately told others and the rest, as they say, is history. Although not all historians agree

with Walbran's version, if true, this would make John McCawley the godfather of B.C.'s mining and tourism industries.

His next brush with notoriety occurred in July 1860 when he and 14 Bella Bellas landed their canoe at Ganges Harbour. McCawley settler accompanied Henry Lineker to his nearby cabin, leaving his companions (nine

men, three women and two children) on the beach. As 50 Cowichans, hereditary enemies of the northern tribesmen were present, this proved to be an unfortunate move. No sooner did they reached Lineker's cabin than they heard gunfire.

It continued for an hour, by which time eight of the Bella Bella men were dead, the women and children taken captive. At least 200 shots were fired, thought Lineker-"some of the bullets flying close to our heads". The lone surviving Bella Bella male, shot three times, managed to escape with Lineker's

help. The Cowichans, he concluded with regret, hadn't lost a man.

Upon Lineker's return to his cabin to see to his family, he found McCawley had beaten him there and stolen his double-barrelled shotgun.

When next McCawley turned

up, he was keeping company with the very Cowichans, it was thought, who'd perpetrated the Ganges Harbour slaughter. Rumour had it that the Bella Bellas had been transporting a valuable cargo of furs to Victoria and that this was the real motive for their murders. The logical inference was that

the renegade whiskey trader had set up his travelling companions for robbery and worse.

By the spring of '67, McCawley's named was linked to a yearslong series of robberies and cattle rustling. Saltspring Islanders such as Burgoyne Bay's John Maxwell pleaded for help from the authorities in Victoria. When no response was forthcoming and his neighbours' cattle continued to go missing, Maxwell vowed to put a stop to the crime wave.

With a dozen neighbours he set up an ambush on the slopes

> of Baynes Peak. Although heavily outnumbered, they had advantage of surprise and when they opened fire from their hiding places, the raiders fled in panic. McCawley was among the retreating rustlers and, back at the beach, he flung himself into a canoe.

> Afatal mistake, as his accomplices, believing he'd betrayed them, stabbed him and dumped his body over the side.

> As stated, Mount Maxwell recalls the pioneer who ultimately proved to be McCawley's nemesis. Victoria's McCauley Point, it should be pointed out, takes its name from an officer of the Hudson's Bay Co. The maps pay no such honour to Cowichan's outlaw, John McCawley.

THE ISLANDS MARKETPLACE RESTAURANT REVIEW: CALVINS BISTRO

A Winning Combo of Great Food & Excellent Service

alvins Bistro was the first restaurant we tried when we moved to Salt Spring Island 7 years ago. Now with a larger family, we happily returned and were welcomed by Swiss owners Hermann Orth and René Widman. Our server, Jena, was making sure everything was perfect before opening the

doors for the dinner guests. The tables were set with burgundy linen napkins and the glasses were glistening in the setting sunlight. The brightly coloured flower beds and original artwork from Gallery 8 in Ganges created the scene for a wonderful dining experience.

It was a beautiful Friday evening so we chose to eat on the licensed outdoor patio, overlooking the Harbour and Rotary Park. We each ordered the German beer on tap "Warsteiner," while we looked over the menu.

Known for their fresh ingredients and succulent seafood dishes, Calvins menu had lots of choices including Fresh Rack of Lamb, Cannelloni Pomodoro, Beef Tenderloin and Lean Pork Loin Schnitzel (which is all highly rated by their regular patrons). It was so difficult to choose. Luckily Chef René came to our table to help us decide. I chose the evening's special: Fresh Wild Halibut, Pacific Salmon and Prawns combo with a brandied lobster sauce. My partner Andrew picked the Pure Beef Burger and our two girls shared the chicken strips from the kids menu.

First we started with some fabulous appetizers: Thai Combo
Platter with Coconut Prawns, Pork Spring Rolls & Prawn & Scallop
Won-Ton with Sweet & Sour Dipping Sauce as well as the highly recommended
Wild Sockeye Salmon TarTare with Won Ton Crisps.

Being a seafood lover, I've tried many varieties, but the tartare was something totally new for me and I wasn't 100% sure if I'd like the raw salmon dish. I was pleasantly surprised to find it extremely creamy and very tasty. While thoughtfully prepared and garnished with huge succulent roe, it was not overly 'fishy" or too salty. Served with the won ton crisps, even my fussy kids liked it.

Andy shared his appy platter, which had plenty for everyone to try. The spring rolls were crispy and melt-in-your-mouth good. I could see myself ordering these for take out and Hermann mentioned that they did offer take out dinners and appetizers as well as complete catering services.

Both Hermann and René trained as chefs, but Hermann's expertise is in restaurant management. He finished his waiter apprenticeship program in Geneva, where he learned the value of good service. Andy noticed the restaurant filling with dinner guests and how Hermann personally greeted each and every one and continued to check on them during their meal. It is clear to us why they are known as #1 for friendly and efficient service.

Our food did not take long, it was piping hot and as fresh as could be. The salmon and halibut were perfectly cooked, flaky, moist and tender. It came with fluffy mixed Red Thai & white rice and delicious crisp vegetables (beets, carrots, peas, zuchini, potatoes and peppers). Andy, who loves his burgers, thought that Calvins was easily the best on the island.

Chef René takes a lot of pride in making his own sauces and stocks for all his dishes. They use fresh locally grown ingredients & herbs, serve local wines and make all their decadent deserts themselves, on-site! Before he became too busy that evening, he shared with us his passion for cooking - he seems well organized and obviously very talented with a true sense of what quality dining is. Fresh, beautiful & delicious, every plate brought to us was as fresh as possible, tasted amazing, was garnished beautifully, and was presented with personality.

René started his cooking apprenticeship in Switzerland at an early age and since moving to Canada has worked in eateries in Montreal and at the Hyatt Regency and the Georgian Court in Vancouver before partnering with Hermann to start Calvins Café in West Vancouver. They began Calvins Bistro on Salt Spring Island 11 years ago. Now with over 19 years combined experience and a fabulous long term staff, they continue to please local patrons and many visitors who return often.

Calvins is well known for their Fresh Halibut & Chips and when a fish & chip loving skipper who cruises local waters did his own survey of his favourite marina eateries around the Gulf Islands, Calvins topped the list for best batter, best fish, best service, best price... even best coleslaw!

For our desert we had the Swiss Meringue au Chocolate with vanilla ice cream, whipped cream and chocolate sauce, as well as the must for chocolate lovers (that's me) the Belgium Chocolate and Grand Marnier Pâté. They were both really delicious, rich and decadent. The chocolate pâté was amazing and the Meringue was not too crunchy, but melt in your mouth yummy.

It was so nice to meet such a passionate and caring team. They work hard together to be one of the islands best restaurants - they take a lot of pride in their bistro, their food and their service - they support local artists, food growers and vintners.

Hermann, René and their staff were easy going and patient, making us feel really comfortable, even when our kids were getting a little fussy! With appetizers from around \$5 and up, and entrees from \$12.75 and up, the prices were accurate for the level of food quality, surroundings and service.

We would definitely recommend anyone to try Calvins for lunch or dinner, with wheelchair access, lots of parking nearby in the heart of Ganges and indoor or outdoor seating, you will be very pleased with your choice in dining locations.

Fabulous Herbs and Spices

Let's start with Parsley, shall we! Also know as (Petroselinum crispum)

Parsley is now grown all over the world – it originated in the eastern Mediterranean region. For more than 2,000 years, it has been known as a medicinal herb. The ancient Greeks valued the seeds and roots of the plant for their soothing, diuretic effect on those with kidney and bladder ailments. Today parsley is still used primarily as a diuretic. In addition, it strengthens the digestive system and helps alleviate stomach and liver problems. Parsley leaves are a good source of many vitamins and minerals – including iron, which is important for proper formation of red blood cells, and also potassium and vitamin C.

Parsley for Osteoporosis – to fight against osteoporosis, sometimes high doses of calcium are taken in supplement form. However, this can impair the body's absorption of manganese, which helps build bone. But! Parsley enhances manganese absorption, particularly when it is eaten with foods containing copper and zinc, such as shellfish and whole grains.

Herbs and spices have been used by us for centuries. There are even cave drawings at Lascaux that show herbs being used more than 15,000 years ago. We have always benefitted ourselves by adding spice and flavour to what we eat, and thereby improving the quality and enjoyment of our lives. I could never live and cook without herbs or spices, I would certainly be lost without them.

My favourite spices are Cumin, cloves, cinnamon, coriander, cayenne and cardamon. Funny how they all start with C! Hmmm! I also enjoy Fresh saffron, which is expensive and strong in flavour. It should be used sparingly. Cumin originally came from Iran and the Mediterranean. And not only is it a flavourful and aromatic spice - it has also had an interesting history as a powerful medicinal herb.

Cloves were one of the first spices to be traded over the high seas. They are native to the Moluccan Islands in the 16th century. And, cloves were once more valuable than gold, believe it or not! It gets its name from the French world "clou", which means nail. And they do look like small nails.

Coriander - the Chinese associate coriander with immortality, and in Greek, Roman and Egyptian times it was considered an aphrodisiac and used in love potions. Hmmm!

I really love Cayenne Pepper and it also has a rich history. For the Aztecs a mixture of chocolate and red pepper chillies was an exotic treat that was exclusively saved for Royal priests.

Cinnamon is actually the dried inner bark of the laurel tree. It is one of the world's most favourite medicinal herbs. Once it was rare and only the elite could afford it. Now it is commonly used everywhere. In ancient times it was prized because it masked the smell and taste of spoiled meats.

And Alas! The delightful taste of Cardamon is something I really enjoy it in my dishes. I find it is particularly tasty crushed in eggnog, with grated cinnamon...and with a spike of brandy poured over ice. Yummy!

*The exotic and interesting history of culinary herbs reminds us again how the art of cooking is such a collage and combination of people and history and is so closely intertwined with the story of civilization. And there is always something unusual and interesting to learn to make cooking and preparing food for the special people in your life such a pleasant and lovely experience.



Parsley Spread

2 bunches parsley 2 shallots 1/2 cup heavy cream 1 cup cream cheese 2 tbsp. lemon juice Salt\White pepper 2 scallions 4 large tomatoes Cayenne pepper

Coarsely chop the parsley. Peel and dice the shallots. Mix together the heavy cream, cream cheese, lemon juice, parsley and diced shallots, season to taste with salt and pepper. Peel the scallions; cut into thin rings. Dice 2 tomatoes, season with salt and cayenne pepper to taste; mix with scallions. Cut the remaining 2 tomatoes into 1/2" slices. Cover them with parsley spread and top with the tomato – scallion mixture.






