THE COWICHAN CONNECTION All Aboard for Crofton!

Early on a February morning in 1902, a Victoria & Sidney passenger train pulled out of downtown Victoria and began its leisurely run through the Saanich Peninsula. By twos and threes its passengers, most of them identified as sportsmen, dropped off until but a handful remained, to troop down to the dock and board the little coastal steamer Iroquois.

Among them, to quote the longdefunct Crofton Gazette, were a real estate agent, "spruce and tidy and looking full of business," several contractors who had made the trip before and were wearing gumboots-wisely, their companions were to learn-a doctor, a railway manager, the manager of a new smelter, and a handful of professional and businessmen intent upon, it was thought, speculating in town lots. As the Iroquois, which ultimately proved to be as unlucky as the town's founder, steamed between Vancouver and Saltspring islands, they talked of stone and lumber, estimates, dollars in tens of thousands, and smelting.

All were bound for Crofton, newly-born Victoria of businessman Henry Croft's desire to process his own copper from Mount Sicker. After two and a-half hours they passed Cowichan and Maple bays and, upon rounding Grave Point, approached Osborne Bay. "At the foot of a gentle slope of wooded hills lies the clearing upon which are dotted the earliest inhabitants of Crofton," wrote the Gazette's correspondent. "To the left Mt. Richards stretches, green

and forest covered, whilst in the distance to the right Mt. Brenton rises, a misty blue mass with scattered fields of snow. But the little patch of cleared land with the vellowish wooden buildings is the mark of all eyes.

"The large double building on the high ground to the left is pointed out to be the smelting offices, and to the left of them again is the smelter site. To the right, stretching back, are a couple of ranches. Their weather-

stained buildings sufficiently denote that they are not a part of a new townsite... The wharf confronts us. It is at present a small structure erected merely for... convenience, but five or six weeks hence there will extend in its place an imposing structure 750 feet long and 60 feet wide, and having a depth of water for the largest ships at its extremity."

The visitors hike to Chaplin Street, northern boundary of the townsite, and only partially graded, thence down the almost-finished main street, Joan Avenue, so-named to honour Croft's mother-in-law, Joan Olive Dunsmuir. At its waterfront end were to be the Mount Sicker & Lenora Railway station and two hotels. J.T. Pearce of Victoria was rapidly building the two-storey, 5,000-square-foot Telegraph, and M.J. Conlin, who'd made his stake in the Klondike, was erecting his own, "strictly first-class" hostelry across the street. Rather than wait

for it to be completed, and to get a head-start on his competition, Conlin was providing meals and beds from temporary quarters.

A. Howe's butcher shop was almost completed and, opposite,

shops were three construction under by Victoria's Moore & Whittington. At the townsite's real estate office, across the way from Mr. Broadwell's rising store, the genial Capt. Mackintosh earned "all sorts of praises from lot buyers for his urbanity business energy"

Crossing King Street, visitors came

to A.B. Whittingham's two-storey boarding house, temporarily serving as a general store while Dyke & Kirkwood put finishing touches to their own building, and two stables were under construction, side by side, for respective proprietors Lindsey and Keast. The latter intended to run a daily stagecoach service between Duncan's, Westholme and Crofton. On York Avenue, although most of its lots had been sold, no development had yet taken place.

Everywhere there were stumps and, from time to time as the

visitors wandered about, 'Dynamite Bill' could be seen "running for his life", and, looking for the cause of his trouble, (we) suddenly hear a thunder sound and see clouds of earth, stones and tree stumps whirled hundreds of feet in all directions. Blasting, of course, will not be permitted much longer so the wiser lot owners are having their larger stumps blasted out at once, while they may."

Such was Crofton, just coming to life in 1902 because of the fabulously rich copper deposits on Mount Sicker and Henry Croft's visions of an empire.

HERE ARE SOME SEASONAL GARDEN TIPS

With so little rainfall this past month on Salt Spring, I have found myself holding a garden hose a lot more than usual. Watering is critical right now to your plants survival.

At this time of year, its best to concentrate on watering, dead-heading & fertilizing. This is also a good time to maintain your perennials, cutting back the ones that need to be cut back.

I always give the plants a quick look to assess their water needs before watering. Some plants need more water than others! After watering a flower box container or an area in your garden, scratch back the top surface of the dirt about 1 inch, if it is bone dry, you need to water it more!

Dead heading is also a crucial to maintaining your annual baskets & containers. Even though dead heading is laborious, it does prolong your plants life & appearance. If you don't dead head, the plants will think they are finished for the season and will begin to close up shop!

Feeding is also vital to your plants health. I fertilize weekly, especially hanging baskets because there are so many plants competing for the soil's attention!

Most importantly of all, enjoy your garden! Step back and admire all of the wonderful colours & subtle scents.......have dinner in your garden on a warm summer's evening......put your feet up and read a good book....pick some flowers from your garden to cheer up a friend......you have plenty of time to savour it now before the next big gardening to-do-list!

I bet our gardens have an abundance of lovely fresh vegetables, let's put some to use...


Soooo - how about trying my absolutely delicious recipe of Gazpacho soup, and let's honor Spain's win of the World Cup...

Gazpacho soup has a rich and ancient history and was first made and used in Andalusia, which is the southern-most and largest of Spain's autonomous regions. It is a cold and delicious soup that originated long ago in the time of glory for Spain and Andalusia when Columbus returned from the new world to Andalusia and the Spanish Empire began. There is red, white and green gazpacho soup, but the red gazpacho is what we are most familiar with. Back then, it was very much a peasant dish.

In the beginning Gazpacho began as a poor people's food, eaten by Spanish workers, who needed to replenish their salt and fluid after a grueling days work building roads and aquaducts through Spain. It was originally composed of bread, water, garlic, salt, vinegar and olive oil which were crushed together in a wooden bowl or "dornillo." And when tomatoes were first brought to Europe by Columbus from the Aztecs in the New World, they became a staple ingredient and the "red" Gazpacho soup was born. It is so very important that garden fresh vegetables are used, at the peak of ripeness. And be sure to use the healthy fat of a good quality extra virgin olive oil for maximum flavor.

Gazpacho soup is full of antioxidants and vitamins. It has no cholesterol and is generally low in calories. Chefs call this soup a "liquid salad", and it is always served cold and fresh. In contemporary times Gazpacho soup includes a variety of vegetables like bell peppers, onions, celery, cucumbers and also lemon juice. It remains true to its ancient and spiritual roots and is one of the most flavorful and healthy uses for those ripe garden vegetables that otherwise might go to waste. There are many delicious recipes to use, but here is one that I have found tasty and delightful.


